

History of The Manor

The recorded history of the Manor begins in the 11th Century. The Manor passed into the ownership of Sir Thomas Pope, founder of Trinity College, Oxford, who acquired the Manor in 1546.

In 1641, the Manor was bought by the Juxon family and in 1644 passed to William Juxon, Bishop of London. William Juxon studied at Oxford and became a Law student of Gray's Inn but then decided to exchange his Law studies for the Church. It is probable that the small deer park within the grounds, dates back to this time.

On Christmas Eve in 1928, a serious fire broke out spreading through the building. All the decoration that was of Juxon's time was destroyed with the exception of the small panelled ground floor parlour. This panelling dates back to circa 1620.

Following the devastation of the fire, the mullion windows were reinstated and the Manor's interior reconstructed. The grounds were landscaped into the formal design that you see today.


In 1939, the Manor was purchased by Sir Edward and Lady Alexandra Metcalfe, daughter of Lord Curzon, Viceroy of India. Lady Alexandra hosted house parties at the Manor, attended by the high society of the 1930s. Her guests included King Edward VIII (before he abdicated from the throne in 1936), Wallis Simpson and her brother-in-law Oswald Mosley.

The Manor was bought by Mrs Dermot Daly, the widow of Captain Singer, of the Singer Sewing machine family, in 1948, and later in 1972 by Sir Alec Reed, following his ambition to own a farm.

Sir Alec and his young family spent a short period of time living in the house before it was opened as a residential accountancy college and named Reed College of Accountancy. It's first course had just three students but the college rapidly grew in popularity.

Courses were held in eight week crammer blocks with lectures running for 12 day continuous stretches commencing from 9am until 10pm. Some of the students who studied at the Manor in its former years are now partners in accountancy firms and are responsible for trainees who study here today.

Our Ground Floor Lecture Room features a beautiful traditional stone fireplace, mullioned windows, and oak floorboards. This spacious, wheelchair-accessible room offers stunning views of our Cotswolds garden and is ideal for meetings, conferences, training days, and private events.
